As expected the behaviour of the pupils during the week was exemplary.



Teen pop star Meredith O'Connor visits Serlby Park Academy with a set of songs aimed at combating bullying

Meredith O'Connor is a rising teen pop star in the US. Her videos have attracted over two million views on YouTube. But Meredith is a rising pop star with a difference, because she's leveraging

her appeal to young audiences to speak out about an issue close to her heart - bullying. The former model and Miss USA pageant contestant was bullied herself during her school years, an experience she's since written about in her song *The Game*. She's gone on to partner with



anti-bullying organisations and has also featured on the American News channel CBS. She is a role model that children all over the world look up to, and her message has changed the lives of many.

Students from Serlby Park Years 6 to 11 were lucky enough to be a part of Meredith's first UK tour. Meredith performed several anti-bullying songs including *The Game* and *Just The Thing*, and also hosted discussions about bullying. Our students were among some of the first people to hear Meredith's new single *Being Me*. Meredith shared her songs and personal story of being bullied with the students just a few years younger than herself. The 18-year-old talked about not fitting in, getting excluded by peers she thought were her friends, and even going home once with a broken nose. She also said she knows there are "horror stories" about those who were bullied much worse than her. She encouraged those who are bullied to seek support from someone they trust, and for those who witness bullying to take a stand against it. "You won't be made fun of ... You'll be looked upon as a hero," she said. "Maybe everyone will follow your lead and start being nice."

We look forward to seeing Meredith in the Future.

RAF Dream Pursuit!

We are delighted that one of our Year 10 students, Alex Cook, has secured a fully funded STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) residential work experience placement on the RAF Cranwell air base. Alex will be teamed with RAF and industrial engineers, who will guide him through every step of the week long placement. The work placement will take place during the Easter holidays. He will have the opportunity to experience the power of engineering first hand, seeing how it solves real life problems. During the week, he will be given the opportunity to:

- Work alongside real engineers from the industry drawing on their knowledge and putting new skills into practise
- Design and build products using a range of different materials
- Understand the importance of budgets, allowing him to calculate the financial impacts of his decisions
- Learn the practical applications of the techniques and processes he will be using
- Gain valuable employment skill; working in a team, communication, time management, problem solving, planning and presentations

There are only 60 STEM work experience placements each year at RAF Cranwell so Alex had a lot of competition. Alex is hoping to secure a career within the RAF so this is another step closer to him achieving his dream!
